ABOUT CFCA

On December 30th, 2004, Community Foundation for Children and Aging (CFCA) was officially registered as a legal entity under the Indian Trust Act 1882, with its head office located in New Delhi, India.

Currently, CFCA is operating in various areas of Uttar Pradesh and Delhi, and is providing benefits to around 3000 underprivileged children and families through its sponsorship program. These benefits are directly transferred to each child's independent bank account with the assistance and coordination of CFCA's field offices. The marginalized families, especially children, receive common benefits through this program.

CFCA is implementing its programs in diverse locations such as metropolitan cities, semi-urban areas, slum and resettlement colonies of Delhi/NCR, and parts of Uttar Pradesh like Prayagraj and Naini. The levels of poverty and socio-economic backgrounds of families in these areas vary. The programs aim to improve child and family welfare and bring sustainable development to the lives of marginalized people.

Our Vision (Dignity, Opportunity, Hope)

CFCA's vision is to play a role in establishing a kingdom of love, peace, and justice by fostering relationships based on mutual respect and enabling people to achieve a life of dignity and brotherhood. CFCA stands by and supports the world's poor and marginalized communities. The organization provides individual attention and direct benefits to children, youth, elderly individuals, and their families so that they can live with dignity, fulfill their potential, and participate fully

Our Values

1. Dignity of the Person

HOPE FOR A FAMILY

CFCA's "Hope for a Family" sponsorship program aims to foster the following characteristics in partnership with sponsored members and their families:

- **1.Mutual accountability and support**: Yes, sponsored families are encouraged to form a support network within the program, where they can exchange ideas, share experiences and provide support to each other. This helps in creating a sense of community among the sponsored families, which in turn helps in enhancing their overall well-being and provides a support system to them during times of need. Additionally, sponsored families are also accountable to one another, which helps in promoting a sense of responsibility and commitment towards achieving the program's objectives.
- **2.Decentralized decision-making**: Encouraging sponsored families to take the lead in selecting personalized benefits and service ensures that their individual needs and preferences are met. By involving the families in the decision-making process, they are empowered to actively participate in their own development and take ownership of the program. The support network and internal controls of CFCA provide guidance and oversight to ensure that the decisions made are in the best interest of the families and aligned with the organization's goals and values.

Every year different categories of letters are being written by the sponsored child to their sponsors such as welcome letter (introductory letter), regular letter, child progress report, and Holiday greeting cards, etc.

The welcome letter, also known as the introductory letter, is the first letter that the sponsored child writes to their sponsor. This letter serves as an introduction and allows the child to express their gratitude towards their sponsor. The welcome letter also provides the sponsor with an opportunity to learn more about the child's background, interests, and family.

Regular letters are the primary means of communication between the sponsored child and their sponsor. These letters allow the child to share their experiences, accomplishments, and challenges with their sponsor. Regular letters also enable the sponsor to develop a personal connection with the child and understand their needs better.

The child progress report is a formal report that provides the sponsor with detailed information about the child's academic performance, health, and overall progress. The report includes the child's grades, attendance, and any other relevant information that may be necessary for the sponsor to evaluate the child's progress.

Letters written by sponsored children play a crucial role in the sponsorship program. These letters help to build trust, transparency, and credibility in the program and increase the sponsor's commitment towards supporting the child's education and well-being.

During the year 2022-23, CFCA's initiatives to train mothers and children in letter-writing skills has been commendable. Effective communication between the sponsored child and their sponsor is essential for building a strong and long-lasting relationship. By providing training to mothers and children on how to write good quality letters, CFCA is helping them to develop these essential communication skills.

Translating letters written in the regional language into English is an excellent way to overcome any communication barriers that may exist between the sponsored child and the sponsor. It ensures that the sponsor can understand the contents of the letter and respond appropriately. Staff and youth scholars who are fluent in both languages play a vital role in translating these letters and facilitating effective communication between the sponsored child and their sponsor.

Speed letters are an excellent way to respond to any queries or special details enquired by the sponsor about their sponsored friend. These letters help to provide the sponsor with the information they need to understand the child's progress and well-being better.

Finally, uploading the latest photograph of the sponsored children every year on the portal is a great way to keep the sponsor updated on the child's growth and development. It also helps to create a personal connection between the sponsor and the child, which is essential for building a strong and long-lasting relationship.

Agents of change- Pilot Program

Agents of change also known as "Parivartan k Sehyogi" describes the initiative and self-motivation of the sponsored mothers in addressing their own problems existing in the communities. Agents of change turned out to be a "community based and community-driven program which was designed by the community members themselves." Mother transformed this opportunity beautifully to seek solutions to the problems that are feasible and manageable to them. Our sponsored mothers group learned to partner together and work in a structured way with commitment towards a common goal.

We know there is a wide array of socio-economic disparities present in the community but agents of change has helped us understand that "we do not have an overall solution for the varied issues in the communities but we together can initiate small changes which will augment the effort in impacting the issues and together we can grow."

ACTIVITIES

The activities conducted during the year 2022-2023 as per the government guidelines and strategy of the organization are mentioned below-

Sponsored Mothers Group/Community Meeting

SMG meetings are organized on a monthly basis in the (PRJ and PRN) Prayagraj and Naini subproject, where a total of 1900 mothers participate on a monthly basis and during these meetings, mothers discuss their community-based problems, solutions, and ways to uplift their children and families. They also discuss skill development, as this can be crucial in helping families break out of the cycle of poverty. Through these platforms many mothers are participating in the Income Generating Program (IGP) and are working hard to improve their families' financial situations. Overall, CFCA-Delhi's focus on empowering mothers and families



has the potential to bring about positive and lasting change in the communities they serve.

Youth Forum Meetings

Youth forum in (PRJ and PRN) Prayagraj and Naini subproject is providing a platform for young people to develop their skills and discuss important issues related to their education and future goals. Some of the youth are making progress in their careers and serving as role models for others. It's important for young people to have access to guidance and mentorship, and the youth forum is a positive step towards providing such support. There are currently 412 members in the youth forum who participate and attend these meetings on a regular basis.





Annual Review & Planning

263 mothers from (PRJ and PRN) Prayagraj and Naini subproject participated in the annual review and planning workshop which was held on 19th Dec, 2022, it was a successful event for the PRJ & PRN subproject. It provided an opportunity for mothers, youth, and children to come together and discuss their needs and goals for the upcoming financial year. Mr. Dass, the Project Coordinator of CFCA Delhi attended this event and shared important information about program development and the challenges as well as new initiatives that is in the



implementation stage for the next year. All the members are grateful for the support provided by CFCA. Overall, the workshop was a productive and enjoyable day for everyone involved as it helped them to strategically plan all the activities for the welfare of the children and families involved in the program. The plans made by these mothers were consolidated to be shared in the Annual plan preparation for the next year.

Health Camp

CFCA organizes health awareness camps on regular basis to educate sponsored children and their mothers about hygiene and illness prevention. A total of 650 children from (PRJ and PRN) Prayagraj and Naini subproject participated in this camp. Dr, Ved Prakash and Dr. Dinesh Kaul conducted these camps for sponsored children. Dr. Ved shared information about healthy foods and their importance in maintaining good health. Success Stories

Case Study-1

Child Name: Umra Mukhtaar, CH ID: 658621

Mother's name: Nazreen Bano

Skill and willpower are two things that help a person in achieving his/her goal in life. We all know that every person has some skills and if that person can recognize and work towards improvising their skills and abilities, then he/she can lead their family towards becoming self-reliant and self- sufficient.

This story is about Nazreen Bano mother of Umra Mukhtar CH ID 658621, a sponsored child at PRJ subproject of CFCA Delhi, currently pursuing B.Com (Bachelors in Commerce). This family comprises of 5 members, which includes Umra's father Mr. Mohammad Mukhtar, who drives an E-rickshaw to support his family. Umra's twin sister, named Bushra Mukhtaar who is also pursuing B.Com 2nd year with Umra, a younger brother Abu Taha, who is currently in L.KG. (Lower Kinder Garten) and her mother Nazreen Bano.

Umra's sponsorship began in September 2011 at that time her father was a mechanic in a motor repairing shop. He had no fixed income. Her mother was a house wife. They were struggling for children's education and family needs. Since they belong to a Muslim family so, mother was not permitted to work outside. But when she joined CFCA program especially after joining mothers group she saw that there were lots of mothers who have skills and have undertaken one or the other task and are proving to be a helping hand for their family's overall growth and development. One day she went to her home and told her in-laws that she would also like to do some work in order to support her family income, but she got a negative response from her in-laws but she never lost hope. Day by day she started sharing with her in-laws about the positive journey of other sponsored mothers who are enriching their skills and supporting their families as well. Whenever CFCA staff would visit her house, they also shared about the program and how Nazreen could enhance her skills and also help her family at the same time. Finally her in-laws agreed and that how Nazreen's journey began.

Nazreen Bano had acquired the skills of stitching from her parents long before her marriage but in order to enhance and improvise that she joined the tailoring training program in the CFCA community center. There she started learning how to sew clothes in a professional manner and when she learned to sew in a good manner, she started her work by stitching fall and pico on sarees. Thereafter she started sewing the clothes of some CFCA family members and started to generate a little amount of money for her family. At that time she had no sewing machine so, she was sewing clothes through the CFCA tailoring unit. After a few months through her saving, she purchased a second-hand sewing machine. Then she started sewing clothes at her home.

She always participates in community-based activities and attends the mothers group meeting with great joy. One day during her sponsored mother's group meeting she shared about the problem of second-hand sewing machine then the CFCA staff and mothers motivated her to take loan from her mother's group for a new sewing machine. She discussed about the loan option with her husband, to which he readily agreed. She took a loan from her SMG and purchased a new sewing machine. Today, she is sewing clothes for community members on a large scale and generates income for her family.

Umra's father also didn't have any fixed source of income and hence was not able to manage his family expenses. One day her father told Nazreen that he wanted to buy an E-rickshaw so that he could support his family in a better way. They started collecting some money to buy an E-rickshaw, Umra's father had some money but it was not sufficient enough to buy E-rickshaw then Nazreen told her husband about some money that she had saved through her tailoring work, and told that he could use the same as well to purchase E-rickshaw. After that they purchased E-rickshaw and now Umra's father is driving his own E-rickshaw and working hard to support his family in a better way.

Umra is a sponsored child as well as a member of Youth Forum. She actively participates in a youth forum meeting and community based activities. She also learned Heena (Mehndi) during the summer training program at CFCA community center. During her schooling she also took part in Heena competition and won prize as well. During the "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava" various competitions were organized at CFCA Community center. She also took part in Mehndi competition. She won second prize in this competition. After lots of practice and hardwork, Umra has now started applying Mehandi during wedding and other festive occasions, through this she also has started earning some money to contribute towards her family needs and is also able to support some part of her education.

Umra and her family are really very grateful to CFCA through which they could enhance their skills and potentials and help their family move forward. Nazreen says that if CFCA would not have been there, then I and my family would not have been able to walk our way out of poverty and would not have been able to educate our children and make them successful.



Case Study-2

Mother's name: Shalini Bhartiya

"A mother is like a flower, each one is beautiful and unique."

Mother is called another face of God because whenever there is a problem in the family or children, the mother fights against every problem without looking at her own problems. Whether she is educated or not, she does every possible effort for the family. This case study is also about a mother, who resides in subproject- PRN in Prayagraj Naini and how she has fought for her family, despite all odds life threw at her.

Shalini Bhartiya is a mother of a sponsored child Shreya Bhartiya. There are 6 members in her family including Shalini and Shreya. Currently, Shreya is studying in class 12th. Her dream is to become a successful teacher. Shreya has two sisters and one brother. Shreya started getting sponsorship support in 2011 and since then Shalini, has been a regular participant in all CFCA activities.

Her life took a drastic turn when her husband Mr. Agam's health started deteriorating. He was working as a laborer and Shalini was a housewife taking care of her family and children. Shalini's family belongs to a rural village where, male folks were the decision makers in the family. Women or girls were neither allowed to work or study. Girls were married off as early as 13-14 years of age. So when her husband's health started depleting, little did she know what to do.

Different people started giving different advices according to the rural set up, environment and the way of thinking and she tried all methods but to no avail. One day during the CFCA SMG meeting the mothers and staff members advised her to take her husband to a good hospital to which she agreed. She visited the hospital twice with the help of the CFCA community members and staff. That hospital was situated in Prayagraj city which is 19 km far from her village and the cost of local transportation was also very high for her to bear.

When she came back home from the hospital, she sat alone and started thinking that if she takes her husband to this hospital once in a week, then the expenses of transportation will be high. And if so how would she be able to feed her family without a job or any financial support. That's when she decided to buy a cycle so that she could take her husband to the hospital, and save transportation cost.Her next worry was how to feed her family and meet their expense, now that husband couldn't go for work. So one day when she came to the hospital in Prayagraj city, she saw so many women selling vegetables and fruits in the city.

Then she thought that if she also brings vegetables from the big market at a wholesale rate and sells it in the near by villages, then she will earn some money in the morning and evening and at the same time she can take care of the children in the afternoon. She discussed this thought

with the community members and CFCA staff. Everyone appreciated her idea. After which she took a loan from her SMG and purchased some vegetables and carried it on her bicycle.

Her business started running smoothly, but now since more vegetables were needed and in demand, bringing them from the market on a bicycle was difficult. That's when she heard about one relative of hers who was selling his Moped (A type of motor bicycle/scooter). She purchased this second-hand Moped by taking a loan from SMG. She learned to ride a Moped and after a few days, she started carrying all the vegetables on the Moped. Now, she is selling vegetables and through this hard work, she is taking care of her family's livelihood, children's education, and also taking care of her husband's health.

Shalini is heartily very thankful to CFCA/Unbound and community members who stood with her through the thick and thin and also supported her to stand strong amidst her challenges.

She has 1 brother named Aryan Mohiley who is currently pursuing B.Com 3rd year. Ananya at present is pursuing her B.A (Bachelor of Arts) course and is also trying her skills in the theater field (plays & drama etc).

Since childhood, Ananya was interested in music (Dancing and singing). She always took part in all the cultural programs organized through CFCA or in her school. She had that in-grained talent in her but she needed to sharpen those skilsl through a music school. One day CFCA staff motivated her mother to get her enrolled in a music academy from where she will get proper education & training in music and get a valid certificate which will be beneficial for her future development. Her mother was perplexed because she didn't know from where she could find a music school for her as she had no knowledge about this field. Then with the help of one youth forum member, CFCA staff collected details and her mother enrolled Ananya in a Music academy named "Prayag Sangeet Samiti". It is one of the oldest and most recommended music schools in Prayagraj". From here Ananya started her journey in classical Music.

One day a cultural program was organized in Prayag Sangeet Samiti and Ananya performed a dance. In that program many renowned directors of drama/play academies were present. One of the drama academy director noticed her skill and after the function, he discussed about Ananya with her music teacher and after completing her course Ananya joined that drama academy named "Swar Raagmandal". From here Ananya took the first step towards enhancing her skills in the field of acting & drama.

Through the Drama Academy, she started learning the basics of musical drama. After a few months, she started performing on stage with the other dramatists of the academy. She gave her best performances in the plays like Panchparmeshwar, Boodhi Kaaki, Ramayan, Samudramanthan, and Bahuroopiya. She gave her theatrical performances not only in her city but expanded her horizons to other states of India like Delhi, Patna, and Chandigarh to name a few. Recently on 8 January 2022, she enacted the role of Panchabhoot (Soil) in the play of Behuroopiya. This play was organized in the NCZCC (North Central Zone Cultural Centre) by the Swarg Rangmandal with the help of the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India. Now her Drama Boodhi kaaki is selected for the National School of Drama, Bhopal, which will be organized in February'2023.

Ananya with her involvement in the Drama academy and through her visit to various places is also developing her entrepreneurship skills and is also getting an opportunity to meet with many famous personalities and learn about the culture/folk arts of various places. Ananya and her family members are very thankful to CFCA/Unbound and to her sponsor by which she got a chance to continue her study and develop her skill. Her family always says that without the help of CFCA Ananya wouldn't have been able to complete her studies, neither could she receive such a great opportunity to establish a name for herself.

Livelihood Initiatives- Herbal Soap Making

Training on Herbal Soap Making- Joint Venture between Community Foundation For Children and Aging (CFCA), DM Office South West District and Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, Najafgarh, Ministry of sports.

On 12th Feb, 2023, a herbal making training was organized in Delhi Pochanpur Village, Dwarka Sub-Project (DPP) which was a joint venture between Community Foundation For Children and Aging (CFCA), DM Office South West District and Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, Najafgarh, Ministry of sports.

Around 120 mothers actively participated in this day long training, which also included 50 mothers from various other NGOs (non- sponsored families) who were running their own livelihood programs in and around the area.

Guest who participated and facilitated this training session were Mr. Naveen Kotiya & Ms. Loveleen (DM Office), Mr. V.K. Dass (CFCA), Mr. Har Govind Arya (Nehru Yuva Kendra, Najafgarh)

The participants were shared about the soap making techniques, how we can prepare a chemical free soap, which can be used for cleansing. The list of items were listed down, few of which included, coconut oil, glycerin, tea, water, salt to name a few. Flavors that participants wanted to add by their own choice like turmeric, flowers, rose petals etc were also kept there. Initially they prepared a base for the soap, and this was poured into soap moulds of different shapes and sizes. After which different scent for fragrance and flavors were added and it was kept to cool down, and that's how the soap was made and shown to all the participants. After this mothers from among the participants were invited to try making soaps on their own and some mothers tried and felt elated to make a soap of their own.



All the mothers who participated received a certificate which was a great moment of pride for all of them. The mothers were very happy to be a part of this training, and the trainer has



assured all kinds of support to mothers, and these mothers would be provided with subsidized loans whenever they wish to initiate this process in their respective SHG groups or Community.

Youth Seminar

Child Protection Training

Child Protection Policy Training is a crucial component of CFCA programs, and CFCA is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all sponsored children. CFCA conducts a quarterly training session in the Pochnapur, Hauzrani and Masjidmoth subprojects, which is usually attended by approximately 50-100 sponsored children and mothers every quarter.

During the training, the various aspects of child protection were covered, including physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, neglect, and exploitation. The aim was to raise awareness about these issues and equip participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent and respond to child protection concerns.

The training provided an overview of the child protection policy, its objectives, and the roles and responsibilities of different stakeholders in implementing the policy. CFCA emphasized the importance of creating a safe and protective environment for sponsored children and the collective responsibility of everyone involved in their care.

Participants were educated on how to recognize signs of abuse, the procedures for reporting suspected cases, and the significance of maintaining confidentiality. CFCA stressed the importance of taking immediate action when there are concerns about a child's safety or well-being.

By conducting Child Protection Policy Training, CFCA aims to empower the staff members, Youth Scholars/volunteers, and community members with the necessary tools to protect sponsored children from harm and uphold their rights. CFCA is dedicated to maintaining a





strong child protection framework within CFCA programs, ensuring the safety, dignity, and well-being of all sponsored children.

Holi Celebration

The Holi celebrations held in Hauzrani, Masjid Moth, and Pochanpur villages from 4th to 6th March 2023 were vibrant and filled with joy. Staff Training/ Youth Scholar Workshop

Staff Training/Youth Scholar Workshops are an important activity in CFCA where several important topics are covered to ensure staff members and Youth stay updated and informed. The meeting serves as an opportunity to discuss key revisions in the Unbound policy manuals, addressing any changes in FCRA (Foreign Contribution Regulation Act) policies, and providing necessary guidelines for compliance.

One of the highlights of the meeting was a presentation by Ms. Shiny, the correspondence coordinator, who shared valuable insights on portal compliances. She discussed various challenges faced during the letter review and submission process, seeking input and suggestions from the staff members to improve efficiency and effectiveness.

They were given a half-day session to better understand their roles and responsibilities, including the process of letter writing and translation. Resource Sharing Agency Visit

Poverty Stoplight

CFCA has been diligently conducting a series of comprehensive training sessions for all the dedicated staff, aimed at enhancing their capacity to conduct impact assessment studies, including the Poverty Stoplight initiative.

Recognizing the significance of understanding the true impact of our programs, CFCA has embarked on a journey of continuous improvement, equipping our team members with the necessary tools and skills to conduct rigorous and insightful impact assessments. Through these training sessions, the staff has been introduced to cutting-edge methodologies and data-driven approaches, allowing CFCA to better measure the outcomes and effectiveness of our initiatives.

One particular area of focus has been the Poverty Stoplight methodology, a powerful tool that enables us to gain a holistic understanding of the living conditions and multi-dimensional aspects of poverty faced by the families and communities we serve. By adopting this approach, CFCA aims to move beyond traditional measures of poverty and delve deeper into the personal



experiences and aspirations of the individuals and families they support.

Capacity building Workshop

The capacity building workshop is a regular activity conducted for mothers from all subprojects to empower them with knowledge, skills, and resources to enhance their participation in the CFCA program. The workshop aims to provide mothers with the necessary tools and information to improve their livelihood opportunities and become self-reliant.

During the workshop, mothers are briefed about the current status of the program and its objectives. They are encouraged to actively participate and share their experiences, challenges, and ideas.
